- Deed to any land you own
- Lease for anything you rent
- Your mortgage and note
- Your loan agreement for your car
- Title or registration to your cars
- Your last six months of bank statements from all of your bank accounts
- Your last 4 years of tax returns
- Proof of your last six months of income
- Any divorce or child support papers
- Any collection letters, lawsuit papers or other things your creditors have sent you
- Papers from any debt management or debt settlement companies you paid to help you
- Any lawsuit papers from anyone
- A list of any lawsuits you think you might be able to bring against anyone
- A list of anyone who you think owes you money

Does it matter whether you are filing chapter 7 or chapter 13?

The list of documents above will be required for either form of bankruptcy relief. Additional document for either Chapter 7 or Chapter 13 may be necessary, but everything on this list will be required no matter which bankruptcy you are filing.
